#### **PCT Fee Tables**

#### (amounts on 1 March 2019, unless otherwise indicated)

The following Tables show the amounts and currencies of the main PCT fees which are payable to the receiving Offices (ROs) and the International Preliminary Examining Authorities (IPEAs) during the international phase under Chapter I (Tables I(a) and I(b)) and under Chapter II (Table II). Fees which are payable only in particular circumstances are not shown; nor are details of certain reductions and refunds which may be available; such information can be found in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Annexes C, D and E. Note that all amounts are subject to change due to variations in the fees themselves or fluctuations in exchange rates. The international filing fee may be reduced by CHF 100, 200 or 300 where the international application, or part of the international application, is filed in electronic form, as prescribed under Item 4(a), (b) and (c) of the Schedule of Fees (annexed to the Regulations under the PCT) and the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, paragraph 5.189. A 90% reduction in the international filing fee (including the fee per sheet over 30), the supplementary search handling fee and the handling fee, as well as an exemption from the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States—see footnotes 2 and 14. (Note that if the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction, as the case may be, and the 90% reduction are applicable, the 90% reduction is calculated *after* the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction.) The footnotes to the Fee Tables follow Table II.

#### **Question 1**

#### CASE 1

International application PCT-M was filed at the European Patent Office as Receiving Office in XML format on 26 August 2016 without claiming priority. PCT-M has 40 pages and 35 claims.

- a. Which fees are to be paid in respect of PCT-M to have it correctly processed without incurring additional fees? Calculate the total amount of the fees to be paid.
- b. Should the Receiving Office find defects in PCT-M, list three defects that do not influence the filing date?
- c. What happens when the Receiving Office finds defects that do not influence the filing date? If there is a time limit involved, include it in your answer.

All defects found by the Receiving Office were corrected by the applicant in time. The filing date of PCT-M was not affected. PCT-M was searched by the European Patent Office as International Searching Authority.

d. What was the last date the applicant could have paid the search fee without incurring late payment fees?

In February 2017 the International Search Authority raised non-unity objections with respect to the subject-matter of claims 20 to 25 and claims 26 to 35 and invites the applicant to pay additional search fees. The applicant does not agree with the International Search Authority.

e. Considering the applicant does not agree with the International Search Authority, what steps should the applicant take to object and still get an international search report on all claims?

Ultimately the applicant did not take further action and the International Searching Authority issued a partial search report covering claims 1-19.

f. What is the time limit for the International Search Authority to establish an international search report?



PCT-M entered the European phase on 26 February 2019, and is referred to in the following as Euro-PCT-M. No amendments were filed.

- g. Will the applicant have an opportunity to amend the claims of Euro-PCT-M, before substantive examination of Euro-PCT-M begins?
- h. Will the applicant be invited to pay a further search fee(s)?
- i. If the applicant had not paid claims fees on 26 February 2018, would Euro-PCT-M have been deemed to be withdrawn?

#### CASE 2

The text intended for grant contains 32 pages of description, 13 claims and 1 drawing. The text of the description and claims is identical to the latest description and claims you submitted.

- h. The opposition division issues an interlocutory decision stating that the patent will be maintained in amended form whereby claims 1 and 6 have been amended. After expiry of the period to file a notice of appeal and such notice has not been filed, the EPO issues a communication pursuant to rule 82(2) indicating that the interlocutory decision has become final.
- i. The opposition division decides to revoke the patent and you wish to challenge this decision.



#### CASE 3

Your client wishes to file a Benelux trademark application at the Benelux Office for Intellectual Property (BOIP) and is considering the languages he can choose from.

a. Which languages can your client choose from with regard to the application for a Benelux trademark registration?

The client chooses to apply for a Benelux trademark registration in the English language. A third party launches an opposition against your client's Benelux trademark application.


- d. What is the time limit your client (the applicant) may inform BOIP that he disagrees to the language of proceedings that the opponent has chosen?
